
The surrounding people noticed the little old lady hadn't eaten a bite. She sat there watching her husband eat and occasionally taking turns sipping the drink.

1/2 tsp white vinegar

1/8 tsp salt

1/4 tsp ground black pepper

Garnish with paprika

Remove the egg yolks to a small bowl and mash with a

fork. Add mayo, dry mustard, vinegar, salt, pepper and mix thoroughly. Some like to add 1 t - 1 T sweet relish.

Put a heaping teaspoon of filling back into empty egg white shells and garnish lightly with paprika. Refrigerate

NOW ADD SOME VARIETY! SPICE THEM UP!

Follow the basic directions but add:

- 1 t Dijon mustard (instead of dry)
- 1 t chives chopped fine
- 3 dashes of hot sauce

MAKE THEM SWEET & SPICY

- 3 T Light Mayonnaise or Salad Dressing (not 1/4 c)
- 1-1/2 T finely chopped onion (Vidalia is nice)
- 2 T sweet pickle relish
- 1 2 t horseradish (more or less to your taste), well drained
- 1 t Dijon mustard (instead of dry)
